

Healthcare Access for Uninsured / Underinsured

Volunteer Clinics for Primary Care and/or Women's Health Services

Eligibility is based upon 200% Federal Poverty Level and inability to access any community-based, government funded clinic (Broward or Memorial). Patients must submit an application for approval prior to being scheduled or seen. Undocumented individuals can qualify for services. There is very limited availability of medications from these sites.

Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHC)

FQHCs are community-based health care providers that receive funds from the HRSA Health Center Program to provide primary care services in underserved areas. FQHC's provide care *to anyone*, of any age. A FQHC treats patients with insurance and those without. Patients who come to a FQHC who are NOT covered by insurance can be charged for their care using an income-based sliding fee scale. Undocumented individuals can qualify for services.

Pharmaceuticals Access

Holy Cross Dispensary of Hope

Patients currently approved for Holy Cross Financial Assistance / Charity Care are eligible to receive FREE medications (including some Insulin) that are on the formulary. Patients must have a prescription and proof of Financial approval. Formulary available from Pharmacy or Community Health and Well-Being. Pick-up is at the HCH Pharmacy.

Broward County Discount Card (sponsored by Ntl. Assn. of Counties and administered by Caremark Rx, Inc.)

Eligibility: must be a Broward County resident. 877-321-2652

Accepted by any participating retail pharmacy; no enrollment form, no membership fee and no restrictions or limits on frequency of use. No enrollment cost or membership fee. Average discount is 20 percent. Cardholders are eligible for higher discounts on a three-month supply of some medications through mail service. Cardholders and their family members may use the card any time their prescriptions are not covered by insurance. Useful option for Medicare Part D as it can the card can be used when a Medicare Part D plan doesn't cover a drug. Approximately 360 pharmacies in Broward County accept the NACo Prescription Discount Card, including: Costco, CVS, Publix, Target, Wal-Mart and Walgreens.

Also applies to pet prescriptions.

- Co-pay coupon cards can be used by anyone, regardless of income, to reduce their out of pocket costs at the pharmacy. Can often be used for 1 to 2 years before you must resign-up.
- Cannot be used with Medicare, Medicaid, Tricare or other government health insurance.

Insulins ValYou Savings Program

- For those without prescription medication insurance
- Monthly supply for any one or combination of Sanofi insulins
 - Up to 10 packs of pens and/or 10 mL vials per month for a set monthly price of \$99
 - Must fill all Sanofi Insulin prescriptions at the same time, together each month
- Insulins included in the program are: Admelog, Toujeo, Lantus, Apidra

Novolin Relion Insulin- Walmart

- Older formulation of insulin
- Works different than newer insulin, so dosage may be different
- Novolin R (Regular Human Insulin Injection) \$24.88 for 100 units/mL 10mL vial
- Novolin N (NPH Human Insulin) \$24.88 for 100 units/mL 10mL vial
- Novolin 70/30 (70% NPH, 30% Regular) \$24.88 for 100 units/mL 10mL vial
- Novolin 70/30 FlexPen (70% NPH, 30% Regular) \$42.88 for 5 x 3mL prefilled pens

- Does NOT include the syringes or needles.

Sharps Disposal Information

- How to dispose of used lancets, needles, sensors, etc:
 - Put used sharps in a strong, plastic containers (such as an emptied laundry detergent or a bleach bottle).
 - When the container is $\frac{3}{4}$ full, put the lid on, seal it with duct tape and label "SHARPS: DO NOT RECYCLE"
 - Put the plastic container in the household trash. Do Not Recycle used sharps!
