




## Harry T. Mangurian, Jr. Foundation Surgical Suites

The Harry T. Mangurian, Jr. Foundation has supported Holy Cross Health for decades, continuing its legacy of philanthropy. ## Jim Moran Heart and Vascular Center

The recent renovation of the Cardiac Catheterization Lab represents a leap forward in our ability to deliver exceptional, patient-centered cardiovascular care. With the addition of a state-of-the-art lab and two more projected for future updates, supported by a 17-bed admission and recovery area, we are now better equipped to manage an increasing patient volume while delivering timely, high-quality care. These upgrades are particularly critical in our community, where we serve numerous residents over 65, many of whom rely on swift and accurate cardiac interventions.

Our Catheterization Lab is a specialized space where doctors perform minimally invasive procedures to diagnose and treat cardiovascular conditions. Using advanced imaging technology, we can precisely guide catheters—thin, flexible tubes that access blood vessels and organs without large incisions—to perform critical procedures such as coronary angiography (imaging of the heart's blood vessels), angioplasty (widening narrowed arteries), and stent placement. Additionally, the updated technology allows us to treat patients with temporary support devices when needed, reinforcing our capacity to deliver life-saving care in a time-sensitive environment.

In January 2024, we opened our Cardiac Imaging Unit, a significant step forward in expanding our capabilities for cardiac care. This unit is specifically designed to perform various procedures, including invasive and noninvasive echocardiograms, cardioversions, and EKGs, allowing us to accommodate more patients. The new unit features 12 rooms: four dedicated to echocardiograms and eight versatile procedural rooms equipped for various invasive and noninvasive procedures, along with areas for patient preparation and recovery. The unit is equipped with the latest monitors and technology, ensuring our patients receive the highest standard of care. Since its opening, the Cardiac Imaging Unit has handled a volume of 60 to 80 procedures each month, demonstrating its pivotal role in meeting the growing needs of our community.

Our fifth floor Cardiology office is undergoing a significant expansion, designed to elevate the level

of care we provide our community. This project is being executed in two phases.

Phase One, completed in March 2024 involved a comprehensive renovation, including new flooring, painting, cabinetry, and state-of-the-art equipment, including Midmark EKGs and Phillips automatic blood pressure cuffs. This newly transformed space now serves as the home for our cardiology associates and interventional team, creating a modern and efficient environment for patient care.

Phase Two will introduce our new Cardiothoracic and Vascular Suite. This expansion represents our ongoing commitment to delivering exceptional care and meeting the diverse needs of every patient who visits our facilities.

With these advancements, we are better equipped to meet the needs of our community, ensuring that every patient benefits from cutting-edge treatments and a seamless care experience.

## Dorothy Mangurian Comprehensive Women's Center



Our commitment to advancing care is supported by key technological investments. The addition of two mammogram diagnostic workstations and several general diagnostic workstations enables our radiologists to read images on-site, ensuring faster diagnosis and improved patient care. These advancements translate into quicker treatment decisions and, ultimately, better outcomes for our patients.

The acquisition of the Hologic Acessa Device marks a transformative step in offering women minimally invasive alternatives to traditional surgeries like hysterectomy. For those suffering from fibroid symptoms, this innovative technology reduced recovery time and complications, significantly enhancing quality of life.

We continue to make strides in advancing women's health, with a focus on serving those most in need. Through our Partners in Breast Health Program (PIBH) in the last two years, we have facilitated over 700 breast cancer screenings for uninsured, lower-income women aged 40 and

over. This initiative empowers women by providing crucial access to life-saving screenings and care that they otherwise might not receive.

By focusing on early detection and timely intervention, we have saved lives and significantly reduced the number of late-stage diagnoses.



## Michael and Dianne Bienes Comprehensive Cancer Center

#### **Patient Spotlight**

In June 2023, Denise was diagnosed with breast cancer. Originally from Boston, she moved to Fort Lauderdale in 2021. Without many friends or family in her new home, the diagnosis was a daunting experience. After seeking a second opinion, Denise decided to be treated at Holy Cross Health.

"Your breast cancer clinic was amazing - please keep doing that! The hospital ran so efficiently," Denise shared. "The thoughtful and organized care at Holy Cross was comforting."

"Of course, I would rather not have been diagnosed with breast cancer, but honestly, it is the best thing that has ever happened to me because it has changed my life for the better, and the healthcare providers I met at Holy Cross Health are the reason for it."







## Chaminade-Madonna High School Volleyball Team

The Chaminade-Madonna girls volleyball teams continued their tradition of giving back through the annual 'CM Cares' Invitational. This event benefits the Michael and Dianne Bienes Cancer Center. Since its inception in 2008, the invitational has generated over \$50,000 in funds, directly supporting advanced diagnostic testing and comprehensive treatment for cancer patients.

#### **Quilt Guild**



In 2023, the East Sunrise Quilt Guild made a thoughtful donation of handmade quilts to the patients at the Michael and Dianne Bienes Cancer Center. Through their Create & Share for Charities Program, the Guild crafts and donates quilts to non-profit organizations across Broward County. These beautiful quilts offer warmth and comfort, bringing a personal touch of care to our cancer patients.

## Sistrunk Clinic

The Sistrunk clinic opened in March 2023 and focuses on addressing the social determinants of health to promote health equity within the community. The clinic, led by nurse practitioners, offers comprehensive services, including primary care, physicals, immunizations, preventative care, diabetes education and prevention, on-site lab work and counseling.

In its inaugural year, the Sistrunk Clinic recorded 1,184 patient visits, demonstrating the community's need for accessible healthcare services.

Holy Cross Health's School Health program supports over 3,000 students annually in Broward County parochial schools and the community by providing essential health services and education. This program provides on-site vision, hearing and scoliosis screenings for students from kindergarten to 6th grade.

The program offers training for school faculty, such as Basic Life Support (BLS), CPR, First Aid and educational sessions for students on topics like hygiene, puberty and dental health. Through the Vaccines for Children (VFC) Program, we help Medicaid-eligible or uninsured children receive necessary vaccinations, promoting healthier families and communities.



Thanks to Florida Blue's generous support, the clinic at Sistrunk has made significant strides in providing accessible, high-quality healthcare to the 33311-zip code. Their contribution has been instrumental in advancing our maternal health initiatives, ensuring that women and newborns in the Sistrunk neighborhood receive essential care and resources.





## Institute for Nursing Excellence

Through the continued support of our donors, the Institute for Nursing Excellence has been dedicated to supporting the professional growth and well-being of our nurses by providing funding for recruitment and retention, educational programs, certifications, training, scholarships, and engagement initiatives. These opportunities have empowered our nursing staff to advance their careers and excel in their roles, enhancing the quality of care they provide.

In line with our commitment to nursing excellence and patient care, we have also invested in a Vein Finder device to assist our nurses in locating veins and starting IVs with greater ease. This innovative technology improves the accuracy and efficiency of IV insertions, enhances the overall patient experience and reduces the risk of infections, further safeguarding the health of our patients.

## Family Health Center

The Holy Cross Family Health Center is nearing completion and is scheduled to open in spring 2025. The renovated facility is made possible through the philanthropic support of The Jim Moran Foundation, The Harry T. Mangurian, Jr. Foundation, S. Donald Sussman, Aetna, and many other generous donors. The 15,500-square-foot facility, located on the first floor of the Medical Plaza at 5601 N. Dixie Highway, will provide comprehensive, patient-centered care by integrating primary care, pediatric speech, occupational and physical therapies, mental health support, culinary teaching kitchen and education space in one convenient location. The center reflects our dedication to providing greater access for patients to address the unique healthcare needs of the Broward community.

## Jon & Helaine Ayers Rehabilitation Institute

The renovation of the outpatient rehabilitation center at the main hospital is on the horizon, thanks to the generosity of Jon and Helaine Ayers and other generous donors. The new center, slated to be completed in spring 2025, will provide comprehensive care for individuals suffering from neurological, oncologic, vestibular and complex orthopedic conditions.

The renovation will include upgrading equipment to the latest advancements in specialized rehabilitation technology. The new equipment will include overhead lift systems, stand-assist devices, a gait and balance overhead track system, balance equipment, specialized exercise equipment, functional electrical stimulation ("FES") bikes and other FES systems, a vestibular chair, hi-low table mats and more.

With a new state-of-the-art facility and equipment, we will deliver the most effective and innovative treatment to those in need.
