Cardiac Arrest Survivor Reunites with Holy Cross Health and Pompano Beach Fire Rescue Teams Who Saved His Life

Ken Sposato regains his health and independence thanks to a treatment called Targeted Temperature Management

In recognition of National Trauma Sur-vivors Day and during National Hospital Week, Holy Cross Health hosted a heart-warming reunion between cardiac arrest survivor Ken Sposato, Pompano Beach Fire Rescue and the Holy Cross Health team who are responsible for saving his life after he

are responsible to saving ins the area ne was transported to the hospital in February. "I thank everyone for saving me," Laud-erdale-By-The-Sea resident Sposato said. "Holy Cross has the best care anywhere. Everyone was very professional, knew their job and did it well. You can imagine my family was so fragile during this difficult time, but [Holy Cross] was always there for them and provided comfort and support beyond the call of duty.'

Sposato celebrated his 76th birthday at the end of May thanks to the team that induced hypothermia when he suffered a car-diac arrest. Tracey Melhuish, MSN, R.N., CCRN, Clinical Practice Specialist at Holy Cross Health, explained how Targeted Tem-perature Management (TTM) can help some patients regain brain function follow-ing cardiac arrest.

TTM is a treatment that is used to lower and or maintain a target body temperature of some patients who suffer cardiac arrest once their heart begins beating again, help-ing some patients regain brain function and ing some patients regain or an function and increasing the likelihood they will wake up. The procedure consists of lowering the pa-tient's body temperature to 32-36°C. This is achieved by placing an intravascular catheter in the body. After 24 hours, the body is gradually rewarmed using the same intravascular catheter and equipment rewarming the body slowly at 0.25°C to a tar-

get of 36.1°C. "It's a great honor to be here celebrating this outcome. This is a win for the entire system here in Broward County," said John P. Cunha, D.O., emergency medicine physi-cian at Holy Cross Health. "Broward

County residents should know that from the moment you call 9-1-1 to those dispatchers walking you through CPR to getting the medics to take over the care, then getting you to an appropriate hospital, it takes every step of the chain of survival to be precise. In this particular instance, it was precise." After recovering in the Holy Cross ICU and the Inpatient Rehabilitation Unit,

Sposato was discharged and is currently liv-ing independently at home with his wife Karen Sposato. Iman Dabiri, M.D., neurocritical care intensivist; Matthew Whitton, EMS Chief, Pompano Beach Fire Rescue; and others involved in his lifesaving care were also present

Interventional pain specialist Giuseppe G.F. Paese, D.O., FAAPMR has joined Holy Cross Medical Group, a multi-specialty physician employed group of more than 130 physicians providing services throughout Broward County.

Before joining Holy Ćross Medical Group, he was medical director of Ageless Health & Surgery Center. Previously, he specialized in interventional pain medicine and rehabilitation at Florida Spine & Sports Specialists, where he also served as Interventional Spine/Sports Fellowship Director.

Dr. Paese began his storied career following graduation from Logan University in St. Louis. Missouri with a Bachelor of Science in Human Biology and a Doctor of Chiropractic (DC). He opened Paese Chiropractic Center in Lapeer, Michigan where he treated back and neck pain and sports injuries for six years. Dr. Paese then became a Certified Chiropractic Sports Physician (CCSP) from the National College of Chiropractic in Chicago. He returned to school to earn his Doctor of Osteopathic Medicine (DO) from Michigan State University in Lansing and upon graduation interned at Genesys Regional Medical Center in Grand Blanc, Michigan. As a sports medicine physician at The

Knee & Orthopedic Center in Lapeer, he treated sports injuries, arthritis and chronic and acute back pain; administered injections and epidurals; assisted on knee, hip and shoulder replacements; and lectured at community and hospital education events.

While completing his Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education (ACGME) Physical Medicine & Rehabilitation (PM&R) Residency and ACGME Anesthesia Pain Medicine Fellowship at Wayne State University/Detroit Medical Center in Detroit, Michigan, Dr. Paese was a physiatrist at a private practice in Lapeer, treating patients with musculoskeletal is sues. He was then named Medical Director and Physiatrist at Communicare, an outpatient traumatic brain injury rehabilitation center in Royal Oak, Michigan.

Dr. Paese then accepted a job in Warren, Michigan as Director of Pain Medicine at Mendelson & Kornblum Orthopedics, where he treated patients with spinal disorders before opening Somerset Regenerative Medicine in Troy, where he was medical director and owner. He also completed the Metabolic Medical Institute/ American Academy of Anti-Aging Medicine Stem Cell Fellowship.

When he's not seeing patients, Dr. Paese is teaching the next generation of physi-



cians as a clinical instructor with the Broward Health North Physical Medicine & Rehabilitation Residency Program, Lincoln Memorial University's DeBusk College of Osteopathic Medicine and Lake Erie College of Osteopathic Medicine.

Board certified by the American Board of Pain Medicine, American Board of Physical Medicine, Rehabilitation and The Metabolic Medical Institute, Dr. Paese also is a Fellow of the American Academy of Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation (FAAPMR). He is a member of the American Academy of Anti-Aging Medicine, American Academy of Pain Medicine, American Academy of Physical Medicine, Association, American Osteopathic Association, American Osteopathic American Society of Interventional Pain Physicians, International Spine Interventional Society and International Association for the Study of Pain.

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Holy Cross Health Awarded on Newsweek's America's Best-In-State Hospitals 2024 List



Holy Cross Health has been awarded on Newsweek's list of America's Best-In-State Hospitals 2024. This prestigious award is presented by Newsweek and Statista Inc., the world-leading statistics portal and industry ranking provider. The awards list can be viewed on Newsweek's website.

Proximity and access are of the utmost importance when choosing between top hospitals. The America's Best-In-State Hospitals 2024 ranking was created to identify the top hospitals at the state level. Hospitals from all U.S. states were eligible for the ranking and included in the nationwide survey. The 25 states with the most hospitals according to the Center for Medicaid and Medicare Services (CMS) were surveyed individually. The remaining states were grouped into 4 regions: Northeast, Midwest, West and South. Leading hospitals from these states were considered accordingly. Four data sources were used for the evaluation:

PROMS Implementation survey: To account for the increasing importance of Patient Reported Outcome Measures (PROMs).

Holy Cross Health's Catherine Yardley Comprehensive **Pulmonary Center Helps Patients Breathe Easier** with New State-of-the-Art High Altitude Simulation Test

Certified in pulmonary function technology (CPFT), the team at the state-of the art Pulmonary Function Lab Holy Cross Health's at Catherine Yardley Comprehensive Pulmonary Center is prepared to diagnose and treat the full spectrum of lung disorders.

The center recently added the High Altitude Simulation Test (HAST) to determine the need for supplemental oxy-gen when flying on an air-

plane or traveling to a higher altitude. The HAST is a safety test for patients who suffer from lung and/or heart disease who may not have the capacity to compensate for the lower oxygen levels experienced while traveling in an airplane and when in mountainous geographical areas like Colorado.

Many patients with underlying pul-monary disease travel by air each year and are therefore at risk for significant car-diopulmonary effects of induced hypoxia at higher altitudes. This includes patients

The HAST provides a simple way to identify those patients at risk by simulating conditions encountered at high altitude. It is an inexpensive diagnostic test in which a trained Respiratory Therapist (RT) can effectively calculate a patient's supplemental oxygen needs for traveling at high altitude The patient's vital signs are initially taken at baseline and continuously throughout the procedure. These may include, but are not limited to, their oxygen saturation in arterial blood, heart rate, blood pressure, respira-

tory rate/depth and skin/mucosal color. A face oxygen mask is then placed on the patient. The mask is fed with a special gas mixture that simulates the lower oxygen level at high altitudes. During this time, the RT continuously observes, assesses and monitors the patient's oxygen saturation. If it drops below 90%, a nasal cannula is applied and adjusted to a level that raises the oxygen saturation back up to 90% or greater. This oxygen level is documented along with all other vital signs, and it is reported to the ordering physician.

Our pulmonary function lead, Victor Falcon CPFT, RRT, takes an active role in maintaining quality standards that produce precise test results. Board-certified pulmonologists interpret the results to provide accurate diagnosis for effective treatment.

The HAST can determine the amount of supplement oxygen needed during air travel. Identifying this prior to flying can reduce the chance of an incident occur-ring during travel, thus allowing the

patient to feel safe and enjoy their trip. Holy Cross Health's Catherine Yardley Comprehensive Pulmonary Center

added the HAST to provide a compre hensive diagnostic menu of tests to best diagnose lung impairment. I believe we are the only facility in Broward County to offer this and the only other one that I know of is in Miami.

In addition, we offer Methacholine Challenge testing, Mannitol Challenge testing and Fractioned Exhaled Nitric Oxide testing (FeNO) to better diagnose and treat asthma, as well as a smoking cessation program. By offering an array of tests we can determine the condition of your lungs, resistance of airflow, lung volumes, the ability of your lungs to absorb and release oxygen and CO2, and how well your airways respond to breathing medications.

Women who are at an increased risk for breast cancer benefit from high-risk breast surveillance and assessment. Women who may be at an increased lifetime risk of developing breast cancer include those with a close family history of breast or ovarian cancer, a genetic predisposition based on an inherited gene mutation (ex. BRCA 1/2 mutations), dense breasts, previous breast biopsies resulting in abnormal or atypical cells and/or prior

chest radiation therapy between 10-30 years of age.

A woman at high risk for breast cancer is noted to have a Tyrer-Cucick lifetime risk calculation of 20% or greater. In these cases, high risk surveillance could be indicated which includes clinical breast exams (CBE) every six months and mammograms once a year, as well as

hol consumption, weight management, prophylactic breast surgery and risk-reducing medications. It is imperative that the medical community understand the importance of screening women for breast cancer, and referring women who are at an increased risk for specialized breast evaluation.

Currently at Holy Cross Health, within the Surgical Oncology department, there

is an established high risk breast clinic that is open for appointments. Women who are determined to be at an increased risk for breast cancer in the high-risk breast clinic will have a risk assessment completed as well as counseling and education regarding recommendations and interventions at the initial and subsequent visits.

Genetic screening and testing are offered to women who meet criteria according to the National Comprehensive Cancer Network (NCCN). Patients who are determined to have an increased risk for breast cancer related to a genetic predisposition are also followed for high-risk surveillance and may also be evaluated by a breast surgeon in the office to discuss surgical risk-reducing options.

At another one of Holy Cross Health's facilities, the Dorothy Mangurian Comprehensive Women's Center, the Partners in Breast Health program provides outreach education, clinical breast

exams, screening mammograms and diagnostic procedures to lower income and minority women ages 40 and older who lack access to healthcare services. The program also provides services to symptomatic women who are younger than 40.

Committed to providing patients with quality care, The Michael and Dianne Bienes Comprehensive Cancer Center at Holy Cross Health maintains accreditation from the National Accreditation Program for Breast Centers (NAPBC), a quality program administered by the American College of Surgeons (ACS).

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
